

THE J.F.L. WOODBURY LECTURE IN RHEUMATOLOGY

Dr. J.F.L. Woodbury

Dr. Jack Woodbury was born in London, England in 1918, although his family roots in Nova Scotia date back to 1750. He received his MD, CM degree from Dalhousie University in 1943 and acquired postgraduate training in Internal Medicine at the Halifax Military Hospital while holding the rank of Captain in the Canadian Army (RCAMC). Dr. Woodbury then spent five years in general practice in Halifax before going to Toronto to train in Rheumatology at Toronto General Hospital and Sunnybrook Hospital. He became a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in 1952.

He was appointed as clinical assistant at the Victoria General Hospital, Halifax in 1945 and joined the Faculty of Dalhousie University as a Lecturer in Medicine in 1950. By 1969, he had become a full Professor in the Faculty of Medicine and was appointed as the first Director of the Dalhousie University Rheumatic Disease Unit. Over the next 20 years, Dr. Woodbury was a pioneer in the care of patients with rheumatic diseases in Nova Scotia and was largely responsible for establishing Rheumatology as a recognized subspecialty in Eastern Canada. He also became a prominent teacher and researcher in Canadian Rheumatology.

Dr. Woodbury was a past President of the Canadian Rheumatism Association and was the founding President of the Society of Atlantic Rheumatologists. In 1994 he was appointed Professor Emeritus in the Faculty of Medicine, Dalhousie University.

Dr. Woodbury died in 2005, but his legacy of establishing a rheumatic disease unit, now called The Arthritis Centre of Nova Scotia, continues his work of patient centred care and research.

About the Speaker

Dr. Oddis has devoted his career to the investigation and treatment of inflammatory myopathy with an emphasis on epidemiology, clinical features, autoantibody associations, pathogenesis, and treatment. He has supervised and managed a clinically- and serologically-defined, longitudinal myositis registry of nearly 2,000 patients, developing a web-based Myositis Data Management System, which enables investigators to link disease activity and damage measures with clinical, laboratory and serologic data over time. Dr. Oddis was the Principal Investigator on the RIM (Rituximab in Myositis) Trial, the first multicenter clinical trial in myositis funded by the National Institutes of Health and the largest clinical trial ever completed in adult and pediatric myositis. He authored the Consensus Guidelines for the Conduct of Clinical Trials in Myositis with several colleagues. Over the years, he has served on a number of multidisciplinary panels that have formulated guidelines in the assessment and management of both myositis and autoimmune ILD. He received the Clinician Scholar Educator Award from the ACR, chaired the ACR Annual Meeting Planning Committee from 2012-2014 and was selected as an ACR Master in 2019.
