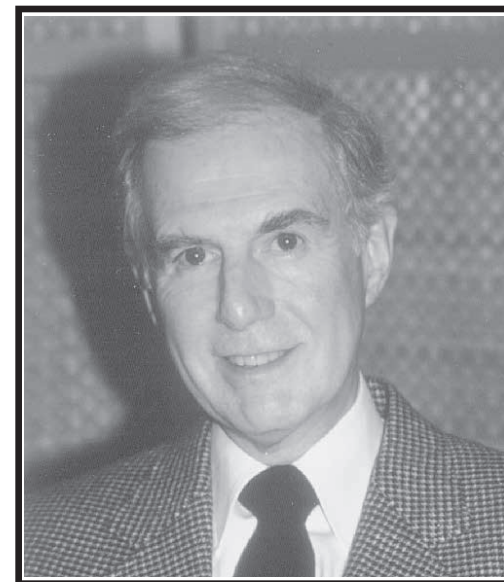

## DR. J.F.L. WOODBURY

Dr. Jack Woodbury was born in London, England in 1918, although his family roots in Nova Scotia date back to 1750. He received his MD, CM degree from Dalhousie University in 1943 and acquired postgraduate training in Internal Medicine at the Halifax Military Hospital while holding the rank of Captain in the Canadian Army (RCAMC). Dr. Woodbury then spent five years in general practice in Halifax before going to Toronto to train in Rheumatology at Toronto General Hospital and Sunnybrook Hospital. He became a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in 1952.

He was appointed as clinical assistant at the Victoria General Hospital, Halifax in 1945 and joined the Faculty of Dalhousie University as a Lecturer in Medicine in 1950. By 1969, he had become a full Professor in the Faculty of Medicine and was appointed as the first Director of the Dalhousie University Rheumatic Disease Unit. Over the next 20 years, Dr. Woodbury was a pioneer in the care of patients with rheumatic diseases in Nova Scotia and was largely responsible for establishing Rheumatology as a recognized subspecialty in Eastern Canada. He also became a prominent teacher and researcher in Canadian Rheumatology.

Dr. Woodbury was a past President of the Canadian Rheumatism Association and was the founding President of the Society of Atlantic Rheumatologists. In 1994 he was appointed Professor Emeritus in the Faculty of Medicine, Dalhousie University.

Dr. Woodbury died in 2005, but his legacy of establishing a rheumatic disease unit, now called The Arthritis Centre of Nova Scotia, continues his work of patient centred care and research.

### Dr. Leonard Calabrese, D.O.

Dr. Calabrese is a graduate of the in Kansas City University of Medicine and Biosciences. He performed his internal medicine training at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation followed by fellowship in rheumatic and immunologic disease. He has been on staff in that department at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation since 1980.

Dr. Calabrese is a Professor of Medicine at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine of Case Western Reserve University and Vice Chair of the Department of Rheumatic and Immunologic Diseases. Dr. Calabrese is the director of the RJ Fasenmyer Center for Clinical Immunology at the Cleveland Clinic specializing in diseases of the immune system, in particular, immunodeficiency diseases including HIV, and hepatitis C infection which are the subject of both his clinical care and investigation. Dr. Calabrese is also the Co-director of the Center for Vasculitis Care and Research and holds a joint appointment in the Department of Infectious Diseases.

Among his many awards and honors, Dr. Calabrese has received an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from the Kansas City University and Biosciences, the Phillips Medal of Public Service from the Ohio University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the Bruce Hubbard Stewart Award for humanitarianism and Leonard Tow Humanitarianism in Medicine award from the Arnold P Goldman MD Foundation and holds two endowed chairs including the RJ Fasenmyer Chair of Clinical Immunology at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation and the Theodore Classen Chair of Osteopathic Research and Education.

Dr. Calabrese is interested in medical history, professionalism and the role of empathy in health care and holds a joint appointment in the Department of Bioethics, Humanities and Spiritual Care as well.

Dr. Calabrese is a member of numerous societies including the American Osler Society. He holds Fellowship in the American College of Rheumatology and American College of Physicians.

Dr. Calabrese has lectured nationally and internationally on the subjects of clinical immunology, rheumatology and virology and is the author of over 400 published peer reviewed articles, book chapters and reviews.
