NEW EDUCATION COMMITTEE, NEW EDUCATION DIRECTOR POSITION

In keeping with recommendations from the Strategic Review Working Group on Education, the Department of Medicine has struck a new Education Committee, which will serve to connect the continuum of education within the Department. The education committee will oversee undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing medical education, beginning with a review of all of the current education committees. A new position of education director for the Department of Medicine is expected to be formalized and filled this fall. The education director will chair the education committee.

MOLLY APPEAL TO BENEFIT MBTB

All proceeds of Dalhousie Medical Research Foundation's 35th annual Molly Appeal will be used to expand the Maritime Brain Tissue Bank (MBTB) for neuroscience research so that it can store more data and more brain and spinal cord tissues from donors with Alzheimer's disease, and those with ALS, epilepsy, spinal cord injuries, MS, Parkinson's disease and a host of other brain and nervous system diseases.

Dr. Sultan Darvesh, Division of Neurology, established the Maritime Brain Tissue Bank 20 years ago to study brains affected by Alzheimer's disease - a quest he will continue as the Irene MacDonald Sobey Endowed Chair in Curative Approaches to Alzheimer's Disease.



The Bank collects brain tissues for examination and experimentation crucial to Dr. Darvesh's work and that of other neuroscience researchers around the world.

DR. JOCK MURRAY NAMED PRESIDENT OF THE JOHNSON SOCIETY



Dr. Jock Murray, Division of Neurology, was inducted as President of the Samuel Johnson Society in England at the annual ceremony at Johnson's birthplace in Lichfield on September 20th. Dr. Johnson was the author of the first great dictionary of the English language. The Society, which was founded in 1928, is made up of people with

interests in the life and work of Samuel Johnson, his circle and his times. Dr. Murray is the first president from outside the United Kingdom. Other presidents have included Malcolm Muggeridge, Conor Cruise O'Brien, Dame Beryl Bainbridge and Nigel Rees.
