The Department of Medical Neuroscience at Dalhousie University invites applications to fill two career stream Instructor positions. The successful candidates will be expected to contribute to the diversity of anatomical teaching offered in our department. Primary responsibilities will include coordinating and teaching gross anatomy to 1) physiotherapy or occupational therapy students and 2) undergraduates in the Bachelor of Medical Sciences program. Contributions to anatomy teaching of medical and dental students, and to postgraduate (resident) trainees, will also be required and assistance supervising the summer prosection program will be expected. Applicants must hold an MD or PhD (in anatomy or closely-related field) and have at least five years of experience teaching anatomy. Prior training and teaching experience must include dissection and laboratory demonstration employing human cadaveric material. The successful candidate will have had experience designing, managing and delivering university-level instruction in the anatomical sciences, ideally including teaching of physiotherapy or occupational therapy students. Salary and rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
