Applications are invited for the position of Maternal Fetal Medicine sub-specialist in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, IWK Health Centre & Dalhousie University. This position is part of a group practice, located in the IWK Health Centre, Women's Site in Halifax, Nova Scotia. The incumbent will hold a continuing academic appointment at the appropriate rank with Dalhousie University. Academic rank upon appointment will be dependent upon qualifications and experience.

This position reports to the Department Head. The successful candidate will possess an FRCSC in Obstetrics and Gynaecology or equivalent certification, and is eligible for, or possesses an FRCSC or equivalent in Maternal Fetal Medicine. Preference will be given to candidates able to start the position in 2019.

In addition to clinical responsibilities, the successful candidate will be expected to contribute to the university teaching program, conduct or participate in biomedical or clinical research, and assume some administrative responsibilities. The Department will give preference to applicants with experience and expertise in all clinical activities, in particular ultrasound, as well as a demonstrated aptitude and interest in research and teaching.
