Applications are invited for the position of Urogynaecologist sub-specialist in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, IWK Women's and Newborn Health Program and Dalhousie University. The successful candidate will possess an MD plus FRCSC or equivalent certification and have completed a recognized fellowship program in Urogynaecology.

This position is part of a group practice, located in the IWK Health Centre in Halifax, Nova Scotia. The incumbent will hold a continuing appointment with Dalhousie University.

This position reports to the Department Head. Academic rank upon appointment will be dependent upon qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will be expected to contribute to the university teaching program, conduct or collaborate in biomedical or clinical research, and assume some administrative responsibilities. The Department will give preference to applicants with experience and expertise in all clinical activities as well as a demonstrated aptitude and interest in research.
