Recognizing and managing acute illness in an infant/child/adolescent with specific chronic disease (e.g. ADHD, JIA, diabetes on insulin pumps, Cystic Fibrosis, inflammatory bowel disease, Duchenne's muscular dystrophy). Patients whose condition is complex, and therefore requires a patient centered approach considering the patient's treatment goals, interactions between different diseases and treatments, consideration of multimorbidity and fraility and, often, coordination with other physicians and health care professionals. Providing anticipatory guidance to the patient and family in the primary care role for overall health maintenance and/or surveillance. May include management of children that are technology dependent, including troubleshooting equipment. Communication (providing anticipatory guidance). May be achieved in various settings, including home care.
