Chief psychoactive phytocannabinoid A partial agonist to CB1 receptor


Nervous system

Cannabidiol (CBD) Δ 9-tetrahydrocannabivarin (THCV)


Chief non-psychoactive phytocannabinoid

	THC %
Joint (lower leaves, stems, seeds)	0.5-5%
Hashish Dried cannabis resin Compressed flower	2-8%
Sinsemilla (flowering tops from unfertilized female plants)	7-14%
Hash oil	15-50%


