He is the Clinical Director of the Nova Scotia Operational Stress Injury Clinic in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, Canada, where he practices ambulatory (office based and remotely delivered) collaborative clinical psychiatry. He is a Canadian Certified Physician Executive and a Certified Psychiatric/Psychosocial Rehabilitation Practitioner. He is a member of the Board of Directors of Research Canada and the Chair of its Task Force on Racial and Indigenous Justice in Health Research and Related Innovation. He is a recipient of the pioneer award in recovery research granted by Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR) / Réadaptation Psychosociale (RPS) Canada and of the Michael Smith award granted by the Schizophrenia Society of Canada, as well as a Fellow of the Canadian Psychiatric Association and a Distinguished Fellow and Gold Medalist of the European Society for Person Centered Healthcare.
