# Dalhousie University Neurosurgery Resident Rotation Objectives – <u>Infectious Diseases</u>

## **Medical Expert**

As a basis for clinical competence, the neurosurgery resident must be familiar with, and able to describe, discuss, and perform (as appropriate):

#### KNOWLEDGE

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of infectious diseases caused by specific pathogens, such as bacteria, mycobacteria, fungi, viruses, parasites, and prions.
- 2. An approach to the diagnosis and management of patients with spontaneous and iatrogenic intracranial and spinal infections.
- 3. Knowledge of common organisms involved in surgical site infections.
- 4. Knowledge of antimicrobial agents, including drug selection, pharmacokinetics, toxicities, and drug interactions.

#### **CLINICAL SKILLS**

- 1. Demonstrate proficiency in eliciting a history and performing a physical examination that is appropriate for an infectious diseases consultation.
- 2. Selection of appropriate investigations and treatments for the diagnosis and management of infectious illnesses.

#### **Communicator**

- 1. Establish therapeutic relationships with patients and their families.
- 2. Document appropriate histories, physical examinations, and progress notes.
- 3. Share clinical information effectively with the infectious disease team as well as the referring service.

## Collaborator

- 1. Consult effectively with referring physicians and other consultants.
- 2. Contribute to interdisciplinary activities as needed.

### Leader

- The neurosurgical resident must learn to manage their time effectively in order to prioritize clinical activities, learning needs, administrative responsibilities, and research endeavours.
- 2. Apply evidence for cost-effective care.

# **Health Advocate**

- 1. Appreciate that patients with infectious diseases may be vulnerable to discrimination.
- 2. Use available resources to assist with patients' educational, socio-economic, and psychological challenges.

# **Scholar**

- 1. Demonstrate self-directed learning with critical appraisal of relevant literature.
- 2. Facilitate the learning of patients and their families, colleagues, and other health care professionals.

# **Professional**

- 1. Demonstrate the characteristics of integrity, honesty, compassion, and ethical conduct.
- 2. Meets deadlines, monitors patients according to the needs of their condition, and provides follow-up.
- 3. Understands any limitations of knowledge or skill, accepts constructive feedback, and corrects deficiencies appropriately.
