- 6) Answering student questions asynchronously or in scheduled meetings with students
- 7) Potentially some learning of material, depending on your background

**REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION:** Applicants having some experience/ facility with statistics, good attention to detail, and a great deal of patience are preferred. You need to be physically present at Dalhousie about twice a week during class time to take this position.
