WORK ASSIGNMENT:

The **PSYO/NESC 2570.03 (Cellular Neuroscience)** teaching assistant will perform the following duties:

- Assist with the editing, organization, and posting of online lectures. - approx. 10 hours
- Assist with production and administration of online tests and/or virtual lab exercises. Invigilate in-person exams. - approx. 50 hours
- Grading of online tests, virtual lab assignments, and/or exams. - approx. 20 hours
- Providing students help by monitoring the course's online forums, and/or meeting virtually with students. - approx. 10 hours

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION:

Applicants must have strong writing skills and have the ability to assist in the planning, development, and execution of high-quality cellular neuroscience-based lectures and assessments. Ability to meet deadlines and a keen attention to detail are requirements. Applicants familiar with Brightspace preferred. Applicants familiar with Panopto and Teams are preferred. Applicants that have taken PSYO/NESC 2570.03 or equivalent are preferred. Applicants specializing in neuroscience and web-based assessments are preferred.

Please Note: *Non-student TA assignments are limited to no more than six hundred and fifty hours per term. For clarity, this means TAs cannot work in excess of five (5) TA130 contracts. If a TA has accepted six hundred and fifty contract hours in a term, they are not able to accept any additional TA, marker or demonstrator hours.*

We encourage you to apply for all positions you are interested in and qualified for. However, these roles typically require periods of high-intensity work at specific points in the semester (e.g., grading duties and student questions around assessment deadlines). These high-intensity weeks often overlap across courses.

The successful applicant will be responsible for ensuring they can complete all duties accurately and in a timely manner and must realistically assess their capacity before accepting the position.
