<b>DEPARTMENT/LOCATION:</b>	Department of Psychology and Neuroscience, Life Sciences Centre, Halifax
<b>PAY RATE:</b>	\$3,863 (one term, 110 hours) as per the CUPE Collective Agreement
<b>WORK ASSIGNMENT:</b>	The Teaching Assistant will assist with <b>PSYO 2501.03 (Statistical Methods I).</b>

Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Help facilitate weekly statistics workshops (i.e., you need to be present for some in-class facilitation while students work on problems).
- Providing some one-on-one assistance by appointment to students who need extra help
- Proofreading quizzes, exams, and workshops prior to release to students
- Uploading quiz questions to Brightspace, proctoring exams
- Potentially some learning of material, depending on your background
- Coordinating quiz extensions and proctoring make-up exams

**REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION:**

Applicants having some experience/facility with statistics, good attention to detail, and a great deal of patience are preferred. You need to be physically present at Dalhousie about twice a week during class time for the workshops at the scheduled times to take this position. Ability to meet deadlines and a keen attention to detail are also requirements.

**Please Note:** *Non-student TA assignments are limited to no more than six hundred and fifty hours per term. For clarity, this means TAs cannot work in excess of five (5) TA130 contracts. If a TA has accepted six hundred and fifty contract hours in a term, they are not able to accept any additional TA, marker or demonstrator hours.*

*We encourage you to apply for all positions you are interested in and qualified for. However, these roles typically require periods of high-intensity work at specific points in the semester (e.g., grading duties and student questions around assessment deadlines). These high-intensity weeks often overlap across courses.*

*The successful applicant will be responsible for ensuring they can complete all duties accurately and in a timely manner and must realistically assess their capacity before accepting the position.*
