Duties may include, but are not limited to:

- 3) Reading & learning any unfamiliar material related to the course

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION: General content knowledge of forensic psychology (e.g., a prior undergraduate course, evidence of research in the forensic area) is required. Specialization in forensic psychology is considered an asset. Ability to meet deadlines and a keen attention to detail are also requirements.

An instructor will be hired to teach this course. The above duties and requirements might therefore be altered somewhat once the instructor is hired.

Please Note: *Non-student TA assignments are limited to no more than six hundred and fifty hours per term. For clarity, this means TAs cannot work in excess of five (5) TA130 contracts during the summer. If a TA has accepted six hundred and fifty contract hours during a given summer, they are not able to accept any additional TA, marker or demonstrator hours.*

We encourage you to apply for all positions you are interested in and qualified for. Please note that summer courses are offered on differing schedules between May and August, and follow a condensed 3- or 7-week schedule. Be aware of the term dates for the course(s) you are applying for, noting that courses may overlap.

The successful applicant will be responsible for ensuring they can complete all duties accurately and in a timely manner and must realistically assess their capacity before accepting the position.
