	<p>Piping Plover <i>Charadrius melodus</i></p>	<p>A shore bird with orange legs, one dark band around neck and an orange bill. Nest on beaches on the ground. Young are precocial (mature and mobile soon after hatching). SARA Schedule 1. Restricted breeding range.</p>
	<p>American Goldfinch <i>Spinus tristis</i></p>	<p>Common. Distinctly yellow bird with black cap. Females more drab in colour. Often seen feeding on thistle seed in open meadows and edge habitat.</p>
	<p>Barn Swallow <i>Hirundo rustica</i></p>	<p>Back side is blue and has an orange-brown breast. Nests mostly inside barns, often seen foraging at dusk and dawn. SARA schedule 1.</p>
	<p>Chimney Swift <i>Chaetura pelagica</i></p>	<p>Aerial insectivore, with curved slender wings that cross over the tail. Can be seen diving in large groups into chimney's to roosts at night. SARA Schedule 1.</p>
	<p>Ruby-throated Hummingbird <i>Archilochus colubris</i></p>	<p>Lays eggs the size of coffee beans. Hovers and flits from nectar bearing flowers. Only males have the bright colouring and red throat. Long distance migrator.</p>
	<p>Bicknell's Thrush <i>(Catharus bicknelli)</i></p>	<p>Woodland bird. Restricted breeding range - prefers high elevation forests. SARA schedule 1. Migratory. Many lookalikes (See grey-cheeked thrush, hermit thrush, ovenbird, veery)</p>
