Dr. Elisabeth Kosters was inducted as a "Keeper of the Cliffs" at Joggins Fossil Cliffs (a UNESCO World Heritage site) on October 24th. Honoring Dr Kosters, Professor Grant Wach attended a United Nations Day Luncheon, as part of the Scientific Advisory Council, in celebration of the world United Nations Day and UNESCO.

UN Day marks the anniversary of the day, in 1945, when the United Nations officially came into being.

UNESCO is the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization which seeks to build peace through international cooperation in Education, the Sciences and Culture with programs contributing to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. It was adopted by the UN General Assembly in 2015.

Dr. Kosters is an experienced Geoscientist who lives in the Minas Basin area where she works as an independent since her retirement in 2002. She completed her BSc and MSc in the Netherlands and then moved to the US where she worked for the Louisiana Geological Survey in the Mississippi Delta Plain; where she completed her PhD on parameters of peat formation in the Mississippi Delta. She was an Adjunct Professor (sedimentology) at Acadia and Dalhousie Uni-

versity, and was executive director of CFES. In addition to this, she ran field schools for the petroleum industry in both Nova Scotia and PEI.

Cape Split Field Trip




