GUEST SPEAKERS

Dr. Ronke Olabisi earned a Bachelor's in Mechanical Engineering from MIT, completed two master's degrees in mechanical and aeronautical engineering at the University of Michigan, and earned her PhD in biomedical engineering from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She is the recipient of several science awards: in 2019 she was named a Biomedical Engineering Society *Young Innovator in Cellular and Molecular Bioengineering*. In addition to her research in tissue engineering and regenerative medicine, she is a member of the 100 Year Starship initiative.

Dr. Ernest Asante Korankye was born in the Ashanti region of Ghana. In Accra he earned a Bachelor's degree in Agriculture with a major in Molecular Biology. He taught one year in Ghana then received a full scholarship to complete his Master's in Plant Physiology at the former Nova Scotia Agricultural College in 2010, subsequently earning his PhD from Dalhousie University's Faculty of Agriculture, in Truro. He is the founder, President & CEO of the successful Asante Logistics Group which ships products across the globe.

Ariel Provo is a fourth year Medical Sciences (Honors) student at Dalhousie University. She will be working in the Marignani Discovery Research Laboratory under the supervision of Dr. Paola Marignani, Professor in the Department of Pathology, to further her research in inhibiting and treating breast-cancer-related tumor growth. She will also contribute to pre-clinical trials and deepen her understanding of fundamental components of technologies and scientific concepts. (In Fall 2021 Ariel will commence her studies at the Dalhousie Medical School.) (\$6500)

Tata Othow is a second year Computer Science student at Dalhousie University. She will be working to further her research in HCI, Visualization & Graphics under the supervision of Dr. Rita Orji, Associate Professor in the Faculty of Computer Science, Dalhousie University. (\$6500)

Mary Lukindo is a third year Medical Sciences student at Dalhousie University. Her research title is: Measuring the Prevalence and Impact of Menstrual Poverty in Adolescents in Nova Scotia. She will be working under the supervision of Dr. Victoria Price, Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at Dalhousie University specializing in the Division of Hematology-Oncology. The objective of this research project is to assess the prevalence of menstrual poverty among adolescents aged 11 to 18, with the hope of using this data to inform the advocacy initiative of free menstrual products at the IWK Health Centre.
