<p>POSITION PROFILE</p> <p>Promoting Leadership in Health for African Nova Scotians (PLANS) and Imhotep's Legacy Academy (ILA) are Dalhousie University-based initiatives that seek to improve the representation of African Canadians in health and science professions by providing opportunities for young learners of African heritage to engage in activities designed to strengthen their health and science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) aptitude.</p> <p>Reporting to the Project Manager, the Developer is responsible for the development and delivery of instruction modules and experiment demonstrations to inspire vaccine confidence in learners of African heritage in Gr. P-12. This project draws from the experience of successful organizations in areas like vaccinology and youth/community engagement to create hands-on activities to challenge misconceptions about vaccines among African Nova Scotian (ANS) youth and other marginalized communities.
