WORK ASSIGNMENT: The Marker will provide support for SUST 1400.03 'Exploring Sustainability'. This online, asynchronous course explores the intersection of environment, sustainability, and society from diverse academic disciplines.

The Marker will grade course assignments, including essays and projects. Payment is hourly as per CUPE collective Agreement. It is anticipated that this position will take 80 - 100 hours, depending on final enrolment.

Markers require personal access to a computer and high-speed internet throughout the period of employment. Markers will be familiar with the Brightspace learning site and will keep accurate records of grades. A mandatory training session will be held at the start of the semester, to be scheduled in consultation with successful applicants.

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION: Applicants must be current Dalhousie Undergraduate or Graduate students or recent (2 years) graduates. Applicants must have experience or background in a field related to Environment, Sustainability and Society and must be proficient at writing in English. Preference will be given to applicants who have been a TA for SUST 1400 in the past. Experience with marking is an asset. The College of Sustainability will request an acknowledgment of the Marker position from grad supervisors by email before the start of term.
