WORK ASSIGNMENT: This online, synchronous course provides students with a foundational understanding of interpersonal conflict management tools and models.

In this position, the Marker will help grade assignments, enter grades in Brightspace, and provide feedback to students on their work. The Marker and course instructor will meet as needed during the term. It is essential that the Marker works collaboratively with the course instructor. The Marker requires personal access to a computer and high-speed internet throughout the period of employment.

Payment is hourly as per the CUPE Collective Agreement. It is anticipated that this position will take 50 hours, depending on enrolment.

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION: Applicants must be current Dalhousie Undergraduate or Graduate Students or recent (2 years) graduates. Preference will be given to applicants who have previously completed the course. Applicants must have suitable background for the position as described above and must be proficient at writing in English. Experience with marking and using Brightspace is an asset. The College of Sustainability will request an acknowledgment of the Marker position from grad supervisors by email before the start of term.
