POSITION: Teaching Assistant for the RBC **Sustainability Leadership Certificate (SLC) Program**.
Beginning FALL 2026 and running until the end of March 2027.

PAY RATE: 90 hours as per CUPE Collective Agreement (\$3160 gross pay).

WORK ASSIGNMENT: The TA will train with our curriculum development team to learn the curriculum and assignments associated with the RBC SLC program. The TA will assist in the delivery of three leadership weekend Modules and will lead parts of the program as requested by the facilitators.

The TA is expected to attend a training/briefing session prior to each Module and must commit to participate in all of the weekend Modules to assist with program implementation. Dates for the training sessions will be announced after the application deadline, and these will be held in an afternoon or evening time slot prior to each Module. The TA will also be providing coaching sessions for participants between modules 2 & 3 and grading the interview and facilitation projects submitted by participants. The Modules will be held over three weekends, dates to be determined.

Module 1: October 2026 (2 days)

Module 2: January 2027 (1 day)

Module 3: March 2027 (1 day)

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION: The RBC SLC TA must be reliable, energetic, and enthusiastic about sustainability, proficient at writing in the English language, and comfortable in facilitating the learning of undergraduate students. Completion of the RBC SLC is beneficial but not required. Experience with design and implementation of social change projects for sustainability is an asset. If applicable, the College of Sustainability will request an acknowledgment of the TA position from grad supervisors by email.
