**Work Assignment:** This teaching assistant will be required to assist the instructor of ARBC1021, Introduction to Arabic I and ARBC2021, Intermediate Arabic I (less advanced students), September – December 2024. The instructor's classes are scheduled for Mondays and Wednesdays 13:05-14:25; Tuesdays and Thursdays, 14:35-15:55. The teaching assistant will be responsible for meeting with the instructor, meeting with students, giving tutorials (a weekly tutorial for ARBC1021 and a bi-weekly tutorial for ARBC2021), marking assignments and tests, invigilating with the instructor the final examination in December, and preparing class material for tutorials. The position reports to the instructor of ARBC1021 and ARBC2021, Dr. Rodica Firanescu.

**Requirements:** Applicants should have a high command of Modern Standard Arabic, oral and written (grammar, reading, writing, and conversation). Preference will be given to applicants with previous experience in teaching Arabic language (MSA) at the university level or/and as a TA for Arabic language classes.
