The Larry D. Stokes Seminar takes place on Tuesdays, from 11:35 am to 12:55 pm in Room 1170 of the Marion McCain Arts & Social Sciences building. The Seminar will also be livestreamed over Teams. For the link, please email Hilary Doda at gradhist@dal.ca.

In the traditional Stokes format, presenters briefly introduce their current research. A paper will often be pre-circulated to faculty, students, and community members, who can then pose questions and make comments about the work. Tuesday, 7 October, 2025 — Norman Pereira (Dalhousie University) — *Michael Karpovich's Liberal Legacy: A "Grandson's" Encomium.* Traditional Stokes format, pre-circulated paper.

Tuesday, 28 October 2025 — Justin Roberts (Dalhousie University) — *Roads and Rebels: Mountains, Mobility and Infrastructure in Jamaica and Scotland, 1720-1746.* Traditional Stokes format, pre-circulated paper.

Tuesday, 4 November, 2025 — Kassandra Luciuk (Dalhousie University) — *Spies, Scandals, and Sabotage in Canada's Wartime Bureaucracy*. Lecture format: 30-45 minute talk, then open floor for discussion.

Tuesday, 2 December 2025 — Phil Zachernuk (Dalhousie University) — *The problem with "African" in Modern African Intellectual History: some reflections and a heuristic gambit.* Traditional Stokes format, pre-circulated paper.
