# WHAT PROGRAMS ARE AVAILABLE?

**Major** and **Honours** programs include Canadian Studies; Cinema and Media Studies; Classics; Creative Writing; English; Environment, Sustainability and Society; European Studies; French; Gender and Women's Studies; German; History; International Development Studies; Law, Justice and Society; Music (BA and BMus); Philosophy; Political Science; Religious Studies; Russian Studies; Sociology and Social Anthropology; Spanish and Latin American Studies; and Theatre.

Minors are also available in subjects including Arabic Studies; Black and African Diaspora Studies; Chinese Studies; Film Studies; Indigenous Studies; Italian Studies; Health Studies; Law, Justice and Society; Medieval Studies; Middle East Studies; Popular Culture Studies; Security Studies, and many more. Our students can also increase the range of options available by pursuing Majors or Minors offered by the Faculty of Science, or Combined Honours programs and Minors offered by the University of King's College.

To help guide first-year students on figuring out which study areas they should pursue that will meet and pique their interests, FASS students will begin their journey at Dal by taking one (with the option to take both) of our Faculty introductory courses (each worth 3 credit hours): Introduction to Humanities (ASSC 1300) and Introduction to Social Sciences (ASSC 1400).

### WHAT CAN I DO AFTER GRADUATION?

We give you skills you can take anywhere: the power to think critically about the world, to express yourself creatively and effectively, and to collaborate well with others. Some of our graduates go on to professional programs such as law, medicine, and public administration; others go on to graduate degrees; many go straight into careers in such areas as the creative industries, education, government, the military, and NGOs. Among our alumni are community activists, government employees, award-winning recording artists, video game designers, translators, communications and health care professionals, and many more.
