GRADUATE STUDIES SERVICES

Admissions (Admissions Officers)

Processing and reviewing applications, providing advice to prospective applicants

Program (Program Officer)

Facilitating general program administration, such as changes to program of choice, program updates, leaves of absence, annual progress reports, etc

Scholarships (Scholarship Officer & Funding Clerk)

Organizes scholarship competitions for Tri-Council awards, Killams, and more; facilitates funding dispersements to award recipients. Maintains external scholarship database

<u>Emergency Bursaries</u> (Information Clerk & Scholarship Officer) <u>Distributes emergency bursaries for students with unexpected financial need</u>

♦ Travel Grants (Financial Clerk)

Distributes grants for students travelling to present their research at academic conferences

♦ Thesis Submissions (Thesis Clerk & Communication Clerk)

Facilitates thesis format checking and submission process for all graduate students

♦ PhD defenses (Thesis Clerk)

Organizes defenses for PhD students

♦ Convocation (Convocation Officer)

Audits all students' degree requirements as approved in GSIS prior to degree conferrals by Senate

Professional development

Organizes professional development opportunities for graduate students in collaboration with other departments

DSU HEALTH PLAN

The DSU Health and Dental Plan: All students starting their academic year in May are required to opt-in to the DSU Health and Dental Plan. Opt-ins can be done in office or online (www.studentvip.ca/dsu) from April 15th to May 24th 2019. This provides students with extended health and dental coverage from May 01, 2019 until August 31, 2019.

The DSU Health and Dental Plan provides coverage for prescriptions, dental, vision, accident and travel. More information can be found online through www.studentvip.ca/dsu. This is an extended plan provided to all students, for services and expenses not covered under a provincial health plan or comparable plan (DSU International Health Plan).

DSU International Plan: If you are an international student, you will be automatically billed through your student account and enrolled into the DSU International Health Plan. The DSU International Plan provides coverage for doctor visits, lab tests, and emergency hospitalization. Contact the DSU Health Plan Office if you have private coverage and are looking to opt-out. Please visit www.internationalhealth.ca/dsu for more information and to get your health card. If you have private coverage which meets Dalhousie's opt-out requirements, you must visit the DSU Health Plan Office by May 24th 2019.

Family Coverage: Spouses & children can be added to the DSU Health Plans as long as they carry active MSI coverage, other provincial health care or have coverage under he DSU International Plan. An application must be completed in office or online by the above deadlines and an additional payment is required. The cost is available by contacting the DSU Health Office. Please note coverage is not automatic for families and family applications must be completed each year.

Opting Out: International Students looking to opt-out of the DSU International Student Health Plan are required visit the DSU Health Plan Office located on the 3rd floor of the Student Union Building (SUB) with proof of private insurance coverage in English by the May 24th 2019 deadline.

Opt-In and out ends May 24, 2019
