ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS Entry-level Occupational Therapy Program

- Must satisfy the general requirements for admission to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
- Minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 (B average) in prerequisites:
- Six credit hours in human physiology
- Three credit hours in human vertebrate anatomy. You should be able to explain and describe, the gross anatomy and histology of the human body at a basic level.

Post-Professional Occupational Therapy Program

- Must satisfy the general requirements for admission to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
 Four-year Bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in occupational therapy from a World Federation of Occupational Therapists accredited educational program
- Letter of intent

Graduate Certificate Program

- Must satisfy the general requirements for admission to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
- Four-year Bachelor's degree in a health, social services or related program

LENGTH OF PROGRAM

MSc (OT/OT-PP): typical time to complete is 2 years full time for research stream students, or 4 years part time.
