- Minimum 3.7 GPA
- Application deadline: Jan 15

APPLICATION DEADLINE

The Sociology and Social Anthropology (SOSA) first round application deadline is January 15. The January 15 deadline is imperative if you expect to be considered for scholarships, and students who apply before this deadline are given priority for admission. Students who apply after January 15 may be considered for admission, but only if space is available. If you are an international student, you are encouraged to apply to our program in December. Admissions are for the September (Fall) term only.
