## **DECISION**

1. Approval of Agenda – There were no additions to the agenda.

2. **Consent Agenda** – The Minutes for the October meeting of Faculty Council were approved by consent.

#### 3. Other Decisions:

- 3.1. Academic Review Committee Recommendations November (Jamie Eliasson)
  - 3.1.1. School of Nursing New Graduate Course Titled: "Mixed Method Research Designs for Health Research"

It was suggested that this course should be made available to other groups, such as PhD in Health students.

This recommendation was accepted unanimously by Faculty Council.

3.1.2. School of Health and Human Performance - Proposed revisions to the equitable admissions policy to adopt the equitable ethos statement updated by the Registrar's Office

This recommendation was accepted unanimously by Faculty Council.

3.2. Faculty of Health Faculty Governance (Brenda Merritt)

This document was created and provided to Faculty Council for input several times. Suggestions were investigated and incorporated, where appropriate, and a final document was provided to Faculty Council today for approval. This document will serve as the Faculty Council "terms of reference" going forward.

Motion: Faculty of Health Faculty Council approves the submitted version of the Faculty of Health Faculty Council Governance Document.

3.3. Nursing Director Reappointment Committee Nominations (Opinio)

Dr. Ruth Martin-Misener's term as Director of the School of Nursing will end in June of 2024. The work to review her tenure as Director with a view to reappoint is starting and the committee is being formed. Faculty Council members were asked to vote on the committee



members, as put forward by the School of Nursing. An Opinio survey link was provided. Cheryl Brown will collate the votes and inform Faculty council of the results; she will also inform Human Resources for the Faculty of Health, who will be responsible for the reappointment activities.

#### DISCUSSION

## 4. Faculty presence on campus (Brenda Merritt)

Dr. Merritt opened a conversation regarding faculty members presence on campus. She noted that having fewer faculty members on campus, i.e., working remotely, is impacting new faculty members with a lack of collegiality. In addition, it may be impacting students, with lower availability.

From a student perspective, it is helpful to students to be able to have access to faculty members on campus. It was also noted that students lack a common collaborative space on campus, which is being worked on as a separate issue.

Units are creating opportunities for faculty and staff to get together; these are social activities and are very welcome. More collaborative activities are needed, even if they are just coffee "dates". It was suggested that high value activities will draw more faculty members to spend full days on campus and increase the collaborative feel of the unit.

It was noted that there are a lot of complaints about not having sufficient space within the Faculty, but the reality is that there is a lot of space showing as empty when people look around because the individuals that normally fill that space are working from home. It's hard to make a case for added space when the perception is skewed.

## 5. Associate Dean Research Reappointment (Brenda Merritt)

The ADR (Shaun Boe) term is ending in June 2024. Faculty Council members are asked to ask amongst their colleagues in the units for individuals to fill the positions open on the committee. They are asked to email the name, email address and a short paragraph of information about the potential committee member to Cheryl Brown (<a href="mailto:Cheryl.brown@dal.ca">Cheryl.brown@dal.ca</a>). Cheryl will then include the names on the form and send back to Faculty Council to vote on the committee members.
