

5. **Dean's Report – Cheryl Kozey**:

Search Committees:

Social Work Clinic:

- Cheryl K. attended opening of new clinic on Quinpool Road
- Clinic demonstrates the power of passion, service, volunteerism
- Strong link to Faculty of Health Strategic Plan areas of citizenship, partnership, teaching and research, as well as the University's strategic plan.
- In addition to Social Work students, the clinic includes staff from OT, Nursing, Pharmacy, nutritionists from MSVU, psychologists

For the Health of It:


- Cheryl K. attended as a judge
- Group raised \$17,000 for the SeaStar Child and Youth Advocacy Centre
- Very interprofessional approach to skits presented
- Exhibited service, citizenship, responsibility to community, which fits with Faculty and University strategic plans

Conflict of Interest:

- John Hope, Dalhousie's new legal counsel, presented to Dean's Council
- Low number of registered conflicts of interest
- Professors do appear to be bringing conflicts to their Directors
- Question regarding policy for Faculty process for registering

Risk Management Policy:

New policy regarding international travel.





- Policy will now cover students as well as staff and faculty.
- Cheryl K. will share the policy when it is formally released
- Restrictions on travel, particularly for students, may be put into place depending on the risk level of the country to be visited; extenuating circumstances may apply (home country, etc.)
- Purpose is to mitigate risk to University
- Feedback was provided by Dean's Council on the document

Unpaid Employees:

- Cheryl K. sent information out to Faculty Council
- Asked that people discuss volunteerism versus unpaid employees
- Labour laws do not allow for unpaid labour, but when does volunteerism become unpaid labour?
- Action: Look at inviting Laura Neal and Karin MacClay to a meeting Workload:
- Task Force has completed a report and sent to Cheryl K.
- Integrate with groups in Strategic Direction 5 that are examining Tenure & Promotion and Uniweb


6. Strategic Plan Update – Suzie Officer:

- Suzie provided a high-level update on work done to date since the launch 18 months ago
- 17 major initiatives and 58 key results to move forward (Suzie will provide these in a word document for Faculty Council)
- Achievelt software was acquired to track progress; allows for reports to be generated
- All strategic direction teams have been organized with Assistant and Associate Deans as team leads
- As an example, the Partnership team has engaged in two "think tanks" to develop a plan; Supports for Innovation (SD5) has broken into small working groups to achieve their goals
- Plan is for all go-forward plans to be in place by the end of 2018.
- More volunteers are always needed, particularly in Parnership/Citizenship.

7. Associate Dean Academic Report – Erna Snelgrove-Clarke:

Student Appeals (Faculty-wide):

- People are needed for the committee two-year commitment
- Currently there is a member each from the following:
 - o Pharmacy
 - o Health and Human Performance
 - Occupational Therapy

- Cheryl B. will forward the newly updated Terms of Reference/Procedures.
- Isabelle French (Legal) is available to talk to faculty members and staff/Director regarding process
- School-level processes need to be moved from web sites and students re-directed to the Faculty web site, which is being updated with the new procedure

Banner:

- Upgrading to version 9 in the next year will not support X/Y courses
- Schools are being asked to move X/Y courses to two courses
- Permission must be requested from the Registrar's Office to allow "no grade" for the first course and the final grade on the second
- Erna will get clarification on the roll-out dates, etc., from the Registrar's Office and share
- Concern expressed regarding administrative processes involved

Associate Dean Research – Shaun Boe:

IHRIS:

- There is a focus on health data provincial health databases so researchers can link databases and have free access.
- Computer Science is hosting workshops on December 11 provide names to and Shaun, who will pass on to Computer Science; they are issuing the invitations.
- A representative is needed from Health for data analytics email Shaun

Research Ethics:

- Faculty of Health provides the highest number of submissions to REB's
- We need to have representatives
- More representatives mean less work for each member of the committee
- Good opportunity to learn about faculty, process, meet people
