\* **IPHE 4900:** Register for this like you would a course but when the semester begins, you will not actually attend a lecture each Tuesday/Thursday as noted in the timetable. Students must register in IPHE 4900 (section 02) every term during the degree program.

**\*\*Open Elective:** This can be any course of your choice for which you are permitted to register. Students should look through many subject areas in the academic timetable to try to find a 1000 level course in a subject area of interest.

#### \*\*\* Writing Requirement Course Options:

- English: ENGL/CRWR 1030.06 (single term)\*; or: ENGL1005.03, ENGL 1015.03, ENGL 1025.03, ENGL1040.03, ENGL 1050.03, ENGL 1100.03
- German: GERM 1026.03, GERM 1027.03
- History: HIST 1022.03, HIST 1023.03 or HIST 1510.06 (single term)\*
- Journalism: JOUR 1002.03, 1003.03

- Oceanography: OCEA 1001.03, 1002.03
- **Performance:** PERF 1000.03, 1001.03, 1002.03
- Philosophy: PHIL 1810.03, 1820.03
- Political Science: POLI 1001.03, 1002.03
- Russian Studies: RUSN 1020.03, 1070.03
- Sustainability: SUST 1000.06 (single term)\*

**Note:** \* 6-credit-hour courses in a single term are the equivalent of two courses in that term and would complete the Writing Requirement plus an Open Elective. To accommodate a 6 credit-hour writing requirement in the fall term (SUST 1000, HIST 1510, or ENGL/CRWR 1030), please consult an advisor for assistance with your course plan/schedule.

Some courses in the Writing Requirement list above may have pre-requisites - please check before selecting your course. For example, OCEA 1002 cannot be taken unless OCEA 1001 has been completed so if looking to do OCEA for the writing requirement, a student would need to select OCEA 1001in the fall semester.



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
