Open Electives: A total of 24 credit hours of Open Electives (course can be any subject available for registration) must be taken. ***** Of the 24 credit hours, 12 credit hours must be 2000 level or above.

<u>Health Related Elective</u>s: Any course in which the majority of content is related to health. Any course from the Faculty of Health or any course with the word 'health' in the title will count. Other courses may be considered – please consult with an advisor.

Students are encouraged to select <u>at least one</u> elective related to the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action and/or equity, diversity and inclusion more broadly. Please consider IPHE 2201 (Intro to Aboriginal Peoples' Health and Healing) or HPRO 3360 (Multicultural Health Promotion) or consult an advisor for other options. The course(s) can count as either Open, HPRO, or Health-Related electives, depending on the course(s).

**IPHE 4900 – Interprofessional Health Education Portfolio

Students in the Faculty of Health Professions **must register for IPHE 4900 each term while registered in their respective degree program**. This is a non-credit requirement that has no course fee. Students will take part in interprofessional collaborative learning experiences that will be outlined by the School each year.

Minors/Certificates

Students in the BHP degree are able to consider a minor and/or certificate but these are not required. The process to declare a minor or certificate can be found in Dal Online. To view a list of minors and certificates along with their requirements, please see the <u>Academic Calendar</u>. Not all minors or certificates are available to all students, nor will they all be possible to fit into the BHP degree. To discuss further, please contact an advisor.

Honours - Students may apply for honours by **November 15th** of the year before their final year of the program. If accepted, students will proceed by taking HPRO 4101 in the subsequent winter term and HPRO 4102 in the fall of their final year. Both courses can count toward electives. Students must obtain a minimum grade of B in 4101 to be eligible to continue in 4102.

To be eligible for honours, students must complete HAHP 3100 before or in the fall term the application is due. A grade of B or better in this course is required, as is a cumulative GPA of 3.70 over the previous 45 credit hours. To apply for honours, please see a HAHP academic advisor.

GPA Requirement for Internship – students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher prior to the enrolling in HPRO 4495.15 (internship).
