



Recreation Management (BScR/BM)

Recreation Management is focused on delivering recreation experiences at the group or community level, and on building and maintaining the systems and programs that support recreation participation.

WHY CHOOSE RECREATION MANAGEMENT AT DAL?

Students in the Recreation Management program participate in a multi-disciplinary five-year degree program, and graduate with both a Bachelor of Science (Recreation) and a Bachelor of Management. The opportunity to earn two degrees in only five years makes this program unique in Canada. Recreation Management students gain skills that prepare them to take on professional roles within the recreation sector and beyond.

The Recreation Management program is the only Recreation program in Canada to be accredited by the Council on Accreditation of Parks, Recreation, Tourism and Related Professions (COAPRT). The rigorous standards required for accreditation ensure a top-quality curriculum and a wide variety of student supports.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH A DEGREE IN RECREATION MANAGEMENT?

Graduates of the Recreation Management program may find employment in a variety of areas in the management and/or recreation sectors, such as:

- Provincial, national and international recreation organizations
- Municipal recreation centres
- Festival and special event management
- Outdoor recreation
- Recreation facility and operations management
- Tourism, leisure, and sport marketing
- Recreation entrepreneurship
- Provincial and national government organizations
- Municipal or provincial government leadership

Graduates may choose to pursue further study in **Recreation and Leisure Studies** or in other health or management related areas at the graduate level.

WHAT ARE THE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS?

HIGH SCHOOL

Completion of grade 12 with a minimum average of 70% in five university preparatory courses, including English and Math (minimum 70%).

TRANSFER STUDENTS

A minimum GPA of 2.00 is required along with English and Math at the grade 12 or university/college level with a minimum grade of 70.

Please note that meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the program.
