**IPHE 4900 – Interprofessional Health Education Portfolio

Students in the Faculty of Health Professions **must register for IPHE 4900 each term while registered in their respective degree program**. This is a non-credit requirement that has no course fee. Students will take part in interprofessional collaborative learning experiences that will be outlined by the School each year.

First Aid /CPR – Please note that students must ensure they have a minimum of Standard First Aid and Level C CPR current certification **prior to going on internship**. Students are responsible for obtaining this certification on their own and a copy of certification will be required prior to obtaining internship approval.

Honours - Students may apply for honours by **November 15th** of the year before their final year of the program. If accepted, students will proceed by taking LEIS 4101 in the subsequent winter term and LEIS 4102 in the fall of their final year. Both courses can count toward electives.

To be eligible for honours, students must complete HAHP 3100 before or in the fall term the application is due. A grade of B or better in this course is required, as is a cumulative GPA of 3.70 over the previous 45 credit hours and a grade of B or better in a course most related to the proposed thesis topic. To apply for honours, please see a HAHP academic advisor.

GPA Requirement for Internship – students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher prior to the enrolling in LEIS 4598.15 (internship).

Other Notes: Students should refer to the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (<u>www.nctrc.org</u>) for information on Therapeutic Recreation certification. It is each student's responsibility to stay up to date on certification standards and eligibility requirements as well as any proposed and/or upcoming changes.

Note that effective January 1, 2022, all applications submitted to NCTRC on or after Jan 1, 2022 will be required to meet the new standard of 18 credit hours of courses in Therapeutic Recreation content. Any changes to the Certification Standards affect applications that are submitted <u>after</u> the change date, therefore if a student applies to NCTRC prior to January 1, 2022 and is granted professional eligibility from NCTRC, <u>they do not need to meet the new standard of 18 credits or 6 courses in TR</u>. If a student applies after that date, they will need to meet the new standards. When a student is granted professional eligibility, it is for a five year period and will remain active as long as the student pays the annual professional eligibility fee. If the student does not take and pass the exam within that five year period and the professional eligibility expires, they will need to reapply to NCTRC and meet the standards that are in effect at the time of reapplication.
