Courses are offered online using BBLearn. There is a high level of interactivity in all courses, and students are expected to fully engage with the content as well as with other students. Discussions are in small and large groups on discussion boards. Other social media and interactive tools are used to deliver content.

Students choose from three electives offered in the Spring/Summer sessions each year in May-June or July-August.

Students are required to complete a two-week residency on-site at the Dalhousie University campus in May of Year 1. This residency is part of SLWK 2335: Beginning Social Work Practice, a half-credit course. Students are responsible for the cost of travel, meals, and accommodation during the two weeks on campus.

Note: all students must complete 10 credits under Dalhousie instruction. Some students may be required to complete more electives than those listed on the table above. These students will receive a revised course sequence from the school advising them of how many extra credits they are required to complete.
