HEATHER MATTICE MEMORIAL AWARD

(3rd Year Nuclear Medicine Technology Students)

Heather Lynn Mattice, a native of Riverview N.B. and a Bachelor of Science graduate of Dalhousie University, completed the first year of the Nuclear Medicine Technology program at the Institute of Technology Campus of the Nova Scotia Community College in June 1995. After her death in a car accident in September 1995, family and friends working with institute staff established an award in her memory. The terms are as follows:

AMOUNT: approximately \$900.00 (based on market value of the endowment fund)

AWARD DATE: Awarded to a Degree Student at the beginning of their Fourth Year. Application forms with supporting documentation must be received by the Bachelor of Health Sciences Office, Room 640 Bethune, by 4:30 pm on the last Friday of Clinical Practicum III in June.

CRITERIA:

1. This award is presented at the recognition reception in the Fall Term to a student in their 4th year of the Nuclear Medicine Technology degree program. The funds will be deposited into the Dalhousie account of the successful recipient.
2. The student must be a resident of Atlantic Canada for the last 5 years.
3. Selection is based on:
 - Financial need (30%)
 - Academic standing (30%) min. GPA of 3.0 based on a 4.3 scale
 - Community/campus involvement and career ambitions (20%)
 - Recommendation of Nuclear Medicine Faculty (20%) based on a rank order system.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

Qualified applicants must complete the Heather Lynn Mattice Memorial Award Application Form and submit their application to the BHSc Office, Room 640 Bethune, before 4:30 pm on the last Friday of Clinical Practicum III in June.

When making their decision, the Awards Committee will consider information from the application form describing each applicant's financial situation, career ambitions and involvement in the community and in campus activities, along with academic achievement in the program to date. Nuclear Medicine Technology Faculty will also contribute input into the selection process based on overall performance in the program to date.
