## **Selection Process for Clinical Law:**

- The selection committee shall be composed of the Executive Director, a student, the Office Manager and a DLAS professional staff member on a rotational basis.
- The committee will use a consensus model for decision making.
- The committee will accept application forms and letters outlining the applicant's interest in the clinic and what attributes they would bring.
- Information in the letters submitted about "social justice" will be considered in prioritizing applicants for selection.
- The committee will consider other courses taken or selected by the applicant that would enhance their clinic experience (Administrative law, Criminal Procedure, Poverty Law)
