The Irving and Ruth Pink Award for Youth Development and Social Justice

The Pink family has a long tradition of giving back to communities, organizations and groups in which they believe in and are passionate about. The late Irving Pink QC, served on a number of boards including the CBC, the Central Trust Company, and Yarmouth Grand Hotel Company Limited. As husband and wife, Irving and Ruth (deceased, October 2014) were involved in fundraising efforts for the Yarmouth Hospital and were able to raise tens of thousands of dollars over the years. This culminated with another campaign to raise seed money to replace the hospital and it ended up raising \$8 million dollars for their cause! They were leaders in the Yarmouth Jewish Community, working extensively for Jewish interests not only locally, but on a provincial and national level.

Known for impeccable integrity in the service of his clients, Irving Pink brought his skills to all parts of the province. In addition to this, Irving worked on behalf of clients throughout the country as well as in the United States and Europe, when they required legal counsel in Western Nova Scotia.

Irving and Ruth have created a legacy in the legal community that has been passed down through three generations, with 12 lawyers in the family to date. Their four children are successful in their chosen fields and continue to follow in their parent's footsteps of integrity and philanthropy.

To celebrate this wonderful family tradition of community involvement and the generous endowment that we have been provided, we wish to recognize the work being done on behalf of youth across our province by recognizing an organization or individual whose contribution and involvement with youth reflects the Pink family values and traditions.
