How to Apply

Applications from interested individuals will be considered for a full-time limited term teaching appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor for one year effective July 1, 2022. Applicants must have a J.D./LL.B. degree, and a graduate degree in law or a related discipline. The successful candidate(s) will have demonstrated the ability or potential for excellence in teaching. Applications received before **May 15, 2022** will be given fullest consideration.

Applications should include a resume, university transcripts, separate teaching statement (maximum three pages total), and the names of three referees, at least one of whom must be an academic referee. If a candidate's graduate degree is in progress, then in their cover letter they should indicate their stage of completion. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
