This position depends on curricular needs and budgetary resources. Applicants must have a J.D./LL.B. degree; applicants must also have a graduate degree in law or a related discipline or equivalent professional experience. Applications received before **March 15, 2018** will be given fullest consideration.

Applications should include a resume; university transcripts; a teaching and research statement (maximum 7 pages); teaching evaluations as available; the names of three referees, at least one of whom must be an academic referee; and a completed Self-Identification Questionnaire, which is available at www.dal.ca/becounted/selfid. If a candidate's graduate degree is in progress, then in their cover letter the candidate should indicate their stage of completion. Applications should be forwarded to:
