

The Schulich Fellowship 2026-2027 Call for Expressions of Interest

Schulich Fellows participate actively in the intellectual life of the Schulich School of Law at Dalhousie University in a way that supports their development as scholars and teachers. Schulich Fellows are expected to teach a course in the required J.D. curriculum and participate in the scholarly activities of the faculty, including the faculty seminar series. It is anticipated that they will be working toward publishing parts of their graduate work and conducting new research. It is not anticipated that Fellows will carry administrative responsibilities.

Applications will be adjudicated on a combination of academic record (including research productivity) and the fit between the applicant's research and teaching interests and the research and teaching needs at the Law School. Applicants are generally expected to be doctoral students in at least their third year of their doctoral studies.

Dalhousie University and the Schulich School of Law are committed to fostering a collegial culture grounded in diversity and inclusiveness. We encourage applications from candidates who would contribute to the diversity of our community.

Fellows are expected to be in residence at the School from the beginning of August 2026 through the end of June 2027. This is an 11-month, part-time academic appointment. Schulich Fellows receive a total stipend of \$55,000.
