The Schulich School of Law at Dalhousie University, with its' location in the vibrant port city of Halifax, is internationally recognized for excellence in marine and environmental law teaching and research.

Teaching

Our flagship program, the Marine & Environmental Law Program (MELP) is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2024. It has provided JD and post-graduate students (LLM and PhD) with one of the most extensive academic course offerings in these two fields in the world since 1974. With 19 full and parttime faculty members currently teaching in the Program, students have a unique opportunity to learn about public and private law practice in marine, maritime (including shipping) and environmental law taught from domestic and international perspectives. JD students wishing to specialize in these fields have the option of obtaining a certificate of specialization in either Marine and/or Environmental Law while completing the three-year JD degree. The MELP specializations are managed by the Associate Director, Associate Professor Sara Ross.

The Schulich School of Law is also home to the Health Law Institute and the Law & Technology Institute. Concentrations are offered in the fields of aboriginal and Indigenous law, business law, criminal justice law, health law and policy, law & technology, international law, and public law. In addition to the required courses in the MELP specialization students are also encouraged to undertake research/courses in these and other fields in the JD curriculum. This allows students to engage with emerging and cross-cutting topics such as biotechnology, environment and health, ethics, indigenous rights, animal rights, food law, international trade law, and human rights.

Research

The long history of research excellence at the Schulich School of Law from the MELAW faculty was formally recognized by the Dalhousie Board of Governors in 2004 with the creation of the Marine & Environmental Law Institute (MELAW). The Institute will be celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2024. The Institute, which is housed in the Law School, carries out research capacity-building and consultancy activities and also directs the MELP academic specialization. The current Director is Professor Sara L Seck, Yogis and Keddy Chair in Human Rights Law. In addition to their scholarly research and publication activities, MELAW faculty and associates carry out research projects and provide advisory services to agencies of the United Nations, international non-governmental organizations and regional organizations as well as assisting government departments, private sector institutions, and nongovernmental organizations in Canada and internationally.

MELAW is home to the editorial office of the Ocean Yearbook (OYB). The OYB is a major interdisciplinary international annual. devoted to ocean affairs published in collaboration with the International Ocean Institute (IOI). MELP law students have the chance to gain experience working as research assistants on the Institute's research projects and workshops and editing OYB. assisting with the
