She has recently co-edited (with Alan D. Hemmings and Donald R. Rothwell) a collection entitled *Antarctic Security in the Twenty-first Century: Legal and Policy Perspectives* (Routledge,



2012). Between 2009 and 2012 she was the General Editor of the *New Zealand Yearbook of International Law*. She is currently the Vice-President of Australian and New Zealand Society of International Law.
