Dr. Elliott A. Norse

Dr. Elliott Norse is the founder and Chief Scientist at the Marine Conservation Institute in Seattle, Washington. He has worked at the conservation science-policy interface for his entire career. After earning his BS in Biology from Brooklyn College, he studied the ecology of blue crabs in the Caribbean and the tropical East Pacific during his doctoral years at University of Southern California and his postdoctoral fellowship years at University of Iowa.

Starting in 1978 he worked at the US Environmental Protection Agency, White House Council on Environmental Quality (where he defined biological diversity as conservation's overarching goal), Ecological Society of America, The Wilderness Society and Ocean Conservancy before founding Marine Conservation Institute in 1996.
