Your Application Package must include:

- A cover letter (highlighting GIS & RS activities)
- A current CV/Resume
- An academic transcript (can be unofficial)
- A GIS Poster (attach as a pdf)
- A GIS Report (done as a story map)

Application Deadlines and format

The guidelines listed are for your poster and summary report, all of which are to be submitted to the GIS Centre by 10 pm on Thursday, March 28th, 2024.

GIS Poster*:

- Must use ArcGIS software
- Must be created by the applicant
- Include a title, your name, and Dalhousie University/Department name
- Graphic quality for printing (min. 300 dpi)
- 61 cm x 91 cm, portrait orientation
- Required file format is pdf
- File size should not exceed 25 MB

GIS Report

- Must explain your project or research
- 800-1000 words maximum if written
- Or, it can be a Story Map
- Could include additional maps and other diagrams
- Or, it can be an app you built.
