Geostatistical Analyst, Tracking Analyst, Data Reviewer, Data Interoperability, Network Analyst, Schematics, Workflow Manager, 3D Analyst, Spatial Analyst, Image Analyst, Publisher, and LocateXT
 - ArcGIS Online Organization Plan (includes 100 service credits and 1 named user)
 - Complimentary maintenance (which provides software updates, technical support and unlimited access to e-learning courses through the Esri Training site)

- An academic transcript (can be unofficial)
- GIS Poster** (attach as a pdf)
- GIS Report** (can be a story map or a pdf)

** 2021 International Esri Young Scholars Award

This is a national competition which will be awarded to one Canadian student. If you follow the guidelines listed below, the same poster and summary report can be submitted to both the Dal GIS Centre (by 8pm on April 11) and to the Esri Young Scholars Award (by 5pm on April 23, 2021).

GIS Poster:

- Must use ArcGIS software
- Must be created only by the applicant
- Include a title, your name, and Dalhousie University
- All graphics of sufficient quality for printing (300 dpi)
- Portrait orientation (24 inches wide by 36 inches high)
- Required file format is pdf
- File size should not exceed 10 MB

GIS Report (explains your project or research):

- 800-1000 words maximum
- Must be a story map
- Could include additional maps and other diagrams
