## **CDL-Atlantic partners with Atlantic Canada's top business leaders** Accelerator program bolsters entrepreneurship and investment through mentorship

The fellows and associates with CDL-Atlantic are mentors and potential investors, who support startups through the completion of the competitive program. CDL-Atlantic has attracted fellows and associates who are leaders not only in the region but nationally and globally.

"This is a tremendous effort to help increase the regional prosperity of Atlantic Canada," says Ken Rowe. "I'm looking forward to mentoring and sharing my experiences with early-stage, high-potential companies."
