Other requirements include a grade of A or higher in both COMM1101 and COMM1102, solid understanding of introductory managerial accounting. Preference will be given to candidates who: have completed or are enrolled in the Winter 2025 offering of COMM3116, are seriously considering pursuing their CPA designation and/or graduate studies in accounting, and who have experience in the application of accounting concepts (financial reporting, data analytics and coding, taxation, cost management, and/or audit) outside of the classroom (e.g., clubs, special projects, research, structured self-study).
