LAUNCH OF THE TRI-COUNCIL POLICY STATEMENT 2: COURSE ON RESEARCH ETHICS 2022 (TCPS 2: CORE-2022)

The Panel on Research Ethics and the Secretariat on Responsible Conduct of Research have released a revised Course on Research Ethics (CORE), based on the Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans – TCPS 2 (2018). <u>TCPS 2: CORE-2022</u> has replaced the previous version of CORE.



GOVERNMENT OF CANADA BACKS MORE THAN 5,500 TRAILBLAZING CANADIAN RESEARCHERS

On January 12, the Government of Canada <u>announced</u> a major investment of over \$550 million to support Canada's science and research sector as part of its 2020 and 2021 competitions. This includes funding for:

- New Frontiers in Research Fund (NFRF) Transformation Stream
- <u>Canada Research Chairs Program</u>
- Tri-agency scholarships and fellowships programs

INTRODUCING THE RESPONSIBLE CONDUCT OF RESEARCH FRAMEWORK (2021) The Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR), the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC), and the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) are pleased to announce the release of the *Tri-Agency Framework: Responsible Conduct of Research (2021)*. The RCR Framework (2021) replaces the 2016 version as the official responsible conduct of research policy of the three federal research funding agencies.

GOVERNMENT OF CANADA MAKES SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENT IN RESEARCH TO TRANSFORM PUBLIC HEALTH FOR CANADIANS

On January 19, 2022 the Minister of Health announced funding of \$8 million for seven new Applied Public Health Chairs and funding of \$2 million for a research funding opportunity that will support projects linked to priorities outlined in the Chief Public Health Officer of Canada's annual report for 2021.
