



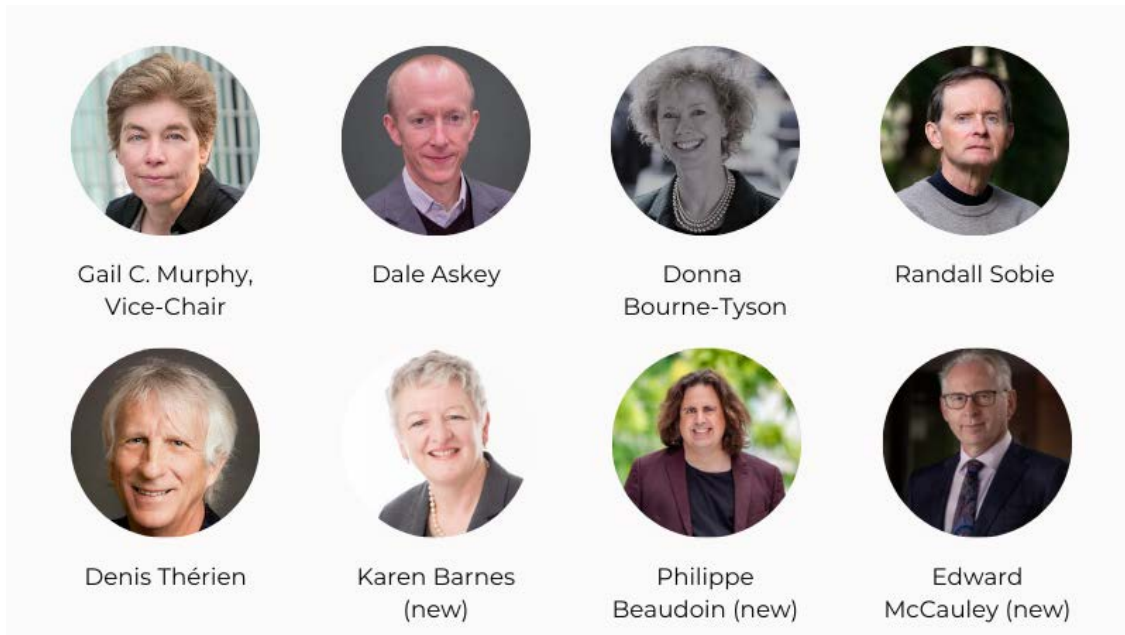

New MOU with KISTI

During International Data Week, the Alliance signed a new memorandum of understanding with the [Korea Institute of Science and Technology Information](#)

(KISTI). This new agreement is an exciting step forward for RDM internationally, and will help facilitate information sharing about RDM platforms and services to better serve researchers in Canada and Korea.

New DMP examples for researchers

The Alliance's Data Management Planning Expert Group released six new example data management plans (DMPs) for researchers. Example DMPs serve as a reference for researchers. ORCID integration in FRDR

Support for persistent identifiers (PIDs) is a key feature in the Federated Research Data Repository (FRDR), helping to enhance research identification and authenticity.
