

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ARE YOU APPLYING FOR CIHR GRANT FUNDS FOR A CLINICAL TRIAL?

CIHR has requirements for registering and publicly disclosing results from clinical trials. These requirements apply to all clinical trial grants funded on or after January 1, 2022. Failure to register your clinical trial or disclose the results can result in the withholding of new CIHR funds.

REMINDER: DOUBLE-CHECK YOUR RESPONSE TO THE REVISED GENDER IDENTITY QUESTION IN THE SELF-IDENTIFICATION QUESTIONNAIRE

On December 16, 2022, CIHR revised the gender identity question in the Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Self-identification Questionnaire to broaden the response options. If you have previously completed the questionnaire:

- As an applicant, you will need to revisit your ResearchNet Account Settings and complete the revised gender identity question (Question #2) before the "Identify Participants" task can be marked as complete in your application.
- As a peer review committee member, your review tasks will remain closed until you have completed the Confidentiality and Conflict of Interest Policy task, which also includes the mandatory Self-identification Questionnaire subtask.
